


# THE SARASWATI YANTRA: A SACRED TOOL FOR INTELLECTUAL AND CREATIVE GROWTH



- **Morning Practices:** Lighting a lamp, offering flowers, and chanting Saraswati mantras.


- **Meditation:** Focusing on the Yantra's patterns to enhance intellectual and spiritual energy.

iii) Monthly and Annual Rituals


- **Full Moon Meditation:** Enhances the Yantra's energy.
